




## FALL SEMESTER 2000 - 2015





# ARRUPE COLLEGE

- Opened in August with 159 students
- Pursuing Associate of Arts Degrees
- Diverse representation: 96 percent are students of color
- First generation
- Pell eligible

  - Directed by Council on Student Success




# RETENTION AND GRADUATION

- Freshmen Retention: 86% (best in 3 years)
- Transfer Retention: 80% (best in 25 years)
- Graduation Rates:
  - 4 year: 69.1% (17 point gain in 10 years)
  - 6 year: 74% (9 point gain in 8 years)

# CAREERS AND JOBS

- Among 2008-2012 graduates, 70% are employed in Illinois.
- 88% of graduates had jobs within three months of commencement.
- Graduating GPA positively correlated with outcomes (employment status, salary).
- Graduates of professional schools (i.e. Nursing) most positive outcomes.
- Of those pursuing graduate or professional studies, Arts & Sciences more likely to do so.

# GLOBAL INITIATIVES


- Deeper connections to Jesuit institutions.

- Over 1,000 international students (+18%).

- Opportunities for improvement– Communications.
- Next Steps: Share data with Departments/Schools; University-wide Survey Update to be distributed in October.

# 2015 FACULTY AND STAFF SURVEY

- First survey for entire Health Sciences Division
  - 65% participation (LUHS surveyed faculty/physicians)
- Results show strong engagement level– 84% Favorable.
- HSD's Diversity & Inclusion – 95% Favorable ☆
- Key Drivers of HSD Engagement in 2015– Resources and Efficiency, Quality and Excellence and Respect and Care.
- Opportunities for Improvement– Communications.
