Household of Prince William, (from 1789) Duke of Clarence 1765-1830

(includes servants to Prince Edward 1778-1781)

Beginning on 5 January 1773, Prince William and Prince Edward received annual payments out of the Civil List. By 1776 these totaled £1,115 per annum plus extraordinaries.¹ By 1783, £11,000 per annum was budgeted from the Civil List for the expenses of Princes Frederick, William, Edward, Ernest, Augustus and Adolphus.² By 1787, the Duke of Clarence was granted a separate establishment of £3,500 per annum, which rose to £12,000 a year by 1790.³ By 1812 his allowance had fallen to £2,500 per annum.⁴
