

San Kirtan Movement One of the most important aspects of the Hare Krishnas is that of its musical rituals. As explained by a devotee in the temple, the movement started in India, where people who felt excluded by the strict caste system came together to worship with music, using it as a way to unite everybody, despite one's role in the caste system. Today, devotees continue the tradition of musical meditation by playing music during meetings, festivals, as well as on Chicago's streets.

Core Ideals

The Hare Krishnas, as I have learned from both their website and members at the temple, are all about "inclusiveness and joy in the discovery of the innate spiritual nature of us all." They believe that there is a distinct difference in the body and the soul, where the body is simply a vessel for our conscious spiritual existence. They believe that the human search for love on a physical level is wrought with pain and disappointment, and instead, should be sought on a spiritual level instead. - Kirtan, or meditation involving spiritual music
- Prasada, or holy offerings in the form of consuming food
